MATTERS FOR DISCUSSION

PROPERTY AND FINANCE REPORTS

The report was taken as read.

Main highlights:

International student numbers will positively affect the budget in 2023. In one to two years, there should be a surplus which will be used for future investments.

Rae and Rive window replacement project with start in 2023.

The landscaping project will be expensive.

The problem with the turf was discussed. M Williams gave an update about how the legal action to get the turf replaced is on-going.

PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

The Report was taken as read.

Main highlights

- Attendance at NCEA end of year exams has been good.
- There will be additional Teacher Only Days in 2023.
- N Troughear asked how the teachers are feeling in light of all of the NCEA changes. M Williams reported that the teachers are finding this tiring as the changes are many and ongoing
- M Turinsky questioned the high change in staff levels. M Williams explained that much of the staff leave at the end of 2022 was due to the transiency of Teacher Aids and that this is to be expected.

STRATEGIC PLANNING

Main points:

- The shift is towards Teaching to the North East which will help with Te Ao Māori (worldview). M Williams talked through the main areas of the 2023 Strategic Plan which will cover 2023-2026.
- The school needs to improve how it guides students to understand how they belong to Pakuranga College. Due to the COVID-related disruptions, senior students do not necessarily know how to ensure everyone feels like they belong to the college.
- Work to be done at Tutor time and training for Peer Support Leaders

- A Plom (Student Rep) talked about how students will not join in if they are not
 passionate about a club/sport, etc. Students also need to know more easily
 about what is going on at school
- Develop tuakana-teina, which is the relationship between and older (tuakana) person and a younger (teina) person
- P Schmidt asked how Teaching to the North East will improve the relationships between students and teachers. M Williams reported there would be improved investment in this through developing coaching through professional development of the coaches.
- M Williams asked the Board to email him with any points they felt needed to be included on the 2023-2026 Strategic Plan

2023 BUDGET

M Williams reported that the budget is due to be better thanks to the support staff and teacher aid top ups from the MoE but there are no definites regarding funding for ORS, etc.

Working capital and equity graphic shows finances are healthy. The college is well set up for future projects, such as a performing arts centre, large scale grounds landscaping.

2023 BOARD MEETING SCHEDULE

N Troughear presented the proposed 2023 meeting schedule. The increase in the number of meetings in Term 1 and Term 2 will allow for increased DP presentations. The schedule of meetings was accepted by the Board.
