UNIFORM CODE



- 1. Students in Year 9-12 are expected to be neatly dressed in correct uniform when at school and when coming to and from school. Students wearing uniform on any other occasion are expected to wear it properly and behave in a manner that brings credit to the college.
- 2. Undergarments worn by students must not be seen beneath or through the school uniform. For example, students may not wear t-shirts which can be seen underneath the collar or through the material of a school shirt.
- 3. If, for any reason, it is not possible for a student to wear part of the school uniform, then that student must bring a note from a parent or guardian requesting a one-day dispensation. This dispensation will only be given in very exceptional circumstances. The note must be countersigned before school by the Whānau Leader or the Deputy Principal in charge of the Whānau. The correct uniform is to be worn on the next day, or parents should arrange to speak with a Deputy Principal.
- 4. Year 13 students may wear mufti in accordance with the Year 13 Dress Code.
- 5. All clothing and other possessions must be clearly and permanently named.
- 6. School bags should be adequate for purpose and may not be decorated with inappropriate graffiti.

All items of uniform are only available from the College Uniform Shop (except shoes). A lay-by system is available.

YEAR 9 AND 10

Trousers/ Shorts Regulation ink trousers or shorts. These must be Pakuranga College issue. Shorts to be worn

properly and not loosely on the hips.

Skirt There are two styles of regulation ink-coloured skirts available, long and knee-length. These

should be worn at the correct length and <u>not</u> rolled up or shortened.

Shirt Regulation mallard button up, long or short-sleeved shirt with Pegasus motif.

Blouse Regulation mallard button up, with white piping and Pegasus motif.

Pullover Regulation mallard/ink blend with Pegasus motif. (The sports hoodie is <u>not</u> to be worn at school).

Jacket / Rainwear Regulation mallard shower-proof, lined jacket.

Physical Education Regulation top and regulation ink shorts. Sports shoes must be worn at all times for Physical

Education.

Scarf Regulation ink wool with mallard stripe or plain black.

Socks Regulation ink with mallard stripe should be worn with shorts. Navy socks should be worn with

trousers and skirts. Navy or black opaque tights may also be worn with skirts.

Footwear Plain flat black dress leather sandals with back strap, worn without socks. Plain black leather

dress shoes for cold weather. All shoes should have a raised but low heel or sole and must be

kept polished. Canvas shoes, ankle boots, skate shoes, or sneakers of any sort are not

acceptable. (Please see footwear guide for examples of appropriate styles).

YEAR 11 AND 12

Wear full regulation uniform as for Years 9 and 10 except:

Shirt Regulation white button up, long or short-sleeved shirt with Pegasus logo.

Blouse Regulation white button up, with piping and Pegasus logo.

Jacket Optional school blazer with mallard stripe.

Sports Students who play in a Pakuranga College sports team may be required to purchase additional

team uniform items. These students may also purchase the sports jacket and track pants. The sports jacket may be worn by these students as an alternative to the regulation mallard

shower-proof jacket.

Sports The sports hoodie is **not** a uniform item and should not be worn at school.

ALL STUDENTS

- a) Hair must be clean and well groomed.
- b) Headbands may be worn in black or white only. No bandanas or headscarves are allowed, unless worn for religious reasons (hijab should be navy, black or white). Students may wear Pakuranga College branded caps or bucket hats, which are available from the school uniform shop.
- c) Jewellery: A plain signet ring may be worn. One pair of **plain** studs may be worn in ears only. Piercing adornments in any other part of the body are not allowed. Plaster or tape covering of piercing is not acceptable. Students should note the Health and Safety expectations in specific subject areas regarding the wearing of jewellery and follow specialist classroom rules.
- d) Tattoos are not to be visible. In the case of cultural tattoos an exemption can be made by the Principal.

Please note carefully that with the exception of shoes, all items of uniform should be purchased from the school uniform shop only. Do not be misled into purchasing trousers which are not school uniform style, colour, or fabric. Garments must not be homemade or made by any firm other than the Pakuranga College uniform suppliers. Should incorrect items of uniform be worn, Whānau Leaders will ask that these are removed and will hold onto the items of clothing returning them at the end of the day. If incorrect uniform items are not removable, no note is received and students refuse to wear correct uniform provided by Whānau Leaders, parents will be contacted, and students will be sent home. Students will be expected to be in correct uniform on the following day.
